# PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF CITIZEN POWER, INC.

Pursuant to the Public Utility Code, 52 Pa. Code § 5.222(d)(1), and in response to the September 26, 2013 Administrative Law Judges' Prehearing Conference Order in the above-captioned matter, Citizen Power, Inc. ("Citizen Power") provides the following information:

### I. History of the Proceeding

On August 2, 2013, Duquesne Light Company ("Duquesne" or "Company") filed Proposed Supplement 81 to Duquesne Light Company's Tariff Electric PA PUC No. 24. Duquesne's filing proposes to increase electric distribution service rates by \$76.3 million, which would allow the Company an opportunity to earn an overall rate of return of 8.36% including an 11,25% return on common equity upon the distribution rate base of \$1.54 billion.

On September 2, 2013, Citizen Power filed a Petition to Intervene. No party has objected to Citizen Power's intervention. On September 26, 2013, the Commission entered an Order suspending the filing pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. §1308(d) until May 1, 2014 and assigning the case to the Office of Administrative Law Judge. Also on September 26, 2013, the Honorable Conrad A. Johnson entered a Prehearing Conference Order setting the date for a Prehearing Conference on October 4, 2013.

# III. Schedule and Discovery Rules

The various parties are continuing to work together to develop a schedule for this proceeding. Citizen Power will continue to work with the parties to develop a reasonable schedule and any necessary modifications to the Commission's discovery rules.

#### IV. Witnesses

At this time, Citizen Power has not determined whether they will offer testimony in this matter. If it is determined that Citizen Power will be calling a witness, the Administrative Law Judges and other parties will be notified as soon as the witness is identified.

#### V. Issues

Citizen Power is in the process of reviewing the filing and testimony submitted by the Company. From a broad perspective, Citizen Power is investigating whether the proposed rate increases and the associated rate of return are reasonable. More narrowly, Citizen Power has

determined that it has concerns that the increase in the fixed charges for residential customers

may discourage energy conservation. In addition, Citizen Power will be investigating the impacts

of the proposed rate increase upon different customer classes. Furthermore, as a supporter of

energy efficiency measures, Citizen Power is examining the proposed inclusion of LED lighting

fixtures in certain tariffs. At this time, Citizen Power continues to evaluate its position on the

filing and will refine its position based upon further study of the plan, review of discovery and

additional input from other parties. Petitioner reserves the right to raise other issues as necessary

and appropriate during the course of the proceeding and to respond to issues raised by other

parties.

VI. Settlement

Citizen Power recognizes the potential savings for the Court and the Parties that can be

achieved through settlement. Citizen Power is amenable to settlement discussions and the

possibility of reaching a settlement in this matter.
